THE recent announcement of a proposed \$5 million combined sports precinct for New Norfolk represents an exciting opportunity for the region ("Bold new plan for battered Boyer", Gazette, May 27).

The proposed precinct would see a combined indoor sporting facility built at Boyer Oval, providing a new home for netball, basketball, squash and other indoor court sports.
