Have your say on Wild Fallow Deer Management Plan

The Tasmanian Government is committed to balancing the impact of deer on our important primary industries and environment while maintaining a deer herd as a traditional recreational hunting resource.

Public input is now being sought to assist with the preparation of a state-wide Wild Fallow Deer Management Plan.

The plan will set the direction for the management of the wild fallow deer herd and will function as a single point of reference for achieving a balanced approach to its management in Tasmania.

The plan will build on the results of the recently completed aerial survey component of the deer census.
