Part of 'A Day in the Dairy', run by Primary Employers Tasmania, it was a great example of how state-of-the-art technology can benefit the agricultural industry.

From using robotic milk stations as part of its voluntary grazing system, to using an iPhone to train fresh cows, robotic technology has given Gala Farm more flexibility in its operations and improved cow comfort, which leads to better production.

Dairy is one of the powerhouses of the Tasmanian economy, worth over \$450 million at the farm gate and over \$700 million when processed.
