## New Basslink owners support Tasmania's renewables future

The Tasmanian Government welcomes the support by APA Group, the new owners of Basslink, for Tasmania's nation leading renewables energy future.

Tasmania is already the renewables powerhouse of Australia by being 100 per cent self-sufficient in renewable electricity with a legislated target of 200 per cent by 2040.

Basslink is a vitally important part of Tasmania's energy infrastructure and we are delighted it will now be run by owner-operator APA Group, one of Australia's leading energy infrastructure businesses.

APA's purchase of BPL will deliver a very good result for the State and secures the outcomes from the 2020 arbitration, which found in favour of the State and Hydro Tasmania.

The Government took a strong stance during the arbitration process last year with BPL to protect Tasmania's interests and we are very pleased with the financial outcome for Tasmania in addition to securing Basslink's future with a respected energy infrastructure owner-operator like APA Group.
