


## LOCAL HERO RECOGNISED WITH NATIONAL MEDAL



The 100th Anniversary of the Great War Commemorative Medallion was unveiled at the Harry Murray VC statue in Evandale on 20 January 2014.

The medallion features Harry Murray VC, Australia's most highly decorated soldier and Alec Campbell, Australia's last ANZAC.

Harry Murray VC was born and bred in Evandale, went to school in Launceston and then departed for Gallipoli via Perth WA, in 1915. He is one of the finest military heroes in our country and I hope the community gets behind this initiative.



## OVER 6500 TEDDY SHEEAN VICTORIA CROSS PETITIONS

Teddy Sheean served on the HMAS Armidale and, when attacked on 1 December 1942 and ordered to abandon ship, he returned to his anti-aircraft gun and fired at enemy aircraft to protect his mates being strafed in the water. Teddy Sheean did this in total disregard for his own safety and life, and was seen continuing to fire as the ship went down.

The Defence Tribunal Report decided that Teddy Sheean's bravery was not worthy of a Victoria Cross. We at the Teddy Sheean VC Award Fight team believe this is a grave injustice. Bravery such as that shown by Sheean should be appropriately honoured.

Our petition asks the Tribunal findings be set aside and Sheean's bravery re-considered for a VC, said Garry Ivory, nephew of Teddy Sheean and Guy Barnett, Liberal candidate for Lyons who as a Senator started the push for justice. "It is thanks to Guy's efforts in the Senate and continued support we now have a chance for justice. We will be writing to the incoming Governor-General, former Defence Chief Peter Cosgrove raising our concerns" Mr Ivory said.
