LIBERALS COMMIT \$23 MILLION TO EAST COAST PROJECTS

The State Liberals will back a host of East Coast projects under a \$23 million plan unveiled last week.

The plan includes –

- \$3 million for the St Helens Hospital to cover planning and the start of construction as well as a long-term health infrastructure study for the region;
- \$3 million to upgrade St Mary's Pass Funding to undertake road works and bridge replacement projects at Esk Main Road between Avoca and Fingal and between Esk Main Rd and the Tasman Hwy;
- \$500,000 for a walking and cycle track around George's Bay and to address Parnella Heights erosion and;
- \$250,000 for a St Helens indoor netball centre

The Liberals long-term plan for the State will help grow the economy, create jobs and reinvigorate communities across the East Coast.

ONLY THE LIBERALS WILL KICKSTART LOUISEVILLE POINT DEVELOPMENT

As part of our long-term plan for Tasmania, a majority Hodgman Liberal Government will invest \$3 million in the joint Louisville Point Development at Orford to kick start this jobs-rich project, which will see public monies invested in common infrastructure to be owned by the Glamorgan Spring Bay Council.

Our investment will encourage the provision of a similar amount of funding from the Federal Government to finalise the commitment needed to progress this \$56 million development, a joint undertaking between two experienced developers and the Glamorgan Spring Bay Council.

This will create up to 430 construction and ongoing jobs on the East Coast, which has been hit particularly hard by the Labor-Green's job-destroying forestry deal.

The green light for this project relies on the funding for the construction of a shared-services model for water and sewerage services, which will resolve challenges for existing properties in the area, and also provide recycled water to maintain the new premium golf course.
